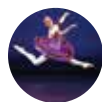

GENERAL INFORMATION

i Doors Open

Generally, our lobby doors open 90 minutes before show time. Please check your pre-show email for the most up-to-date information regarding your specific event.

i Lost and Found

Found articles should be left with any Auditorium team member. To determine if a personal article has been turned in, please call 312.341.2300. Any items lost or presumed stolen are not the responsibility of the Auditorium Theatre. Items will be held on-site for 30 days only.

i Misplaced Tickets

Misplaced tickets may be replaced by calling the Ticket Services Center. If you misplace your ticket(s) within 24 hours of performance or after TSC hours, please go to the Box Office with a valid photo ID AT LEAST 45 minutes before curtain.

**When misplaced tickets are replaced, the bar code on the original set of tickets is deactivated. If you find your original set of misplaced tickets, please destroy them to avoid confusion!*

i Coat Check

Coat check is located between Aisles 2 and Aisle 3 in the Main Floor Lobby. The coat check also features complimentary seat cushions/booster seats, disposable ear plugs, and assistive listening devices.

i Assistive Listening Devices

Guests can obtain infrared assistive listening devices from our coat check team. Coat check is located between Aisles 2 and Aisle 3 in the Main Floor Lobby. Assistive listening devices can be secured by leaving a photo ID and are free of charge. Assistive Listening Devices are available on a first-come, first-serve basis.

i Accessible Seating

Nearly all the seats in the theatre require guests to navigate steps in the lobby space and/or in the house. Accessible tickets can be purchased at the Box Office or by calling 312.341.2300.

Please note: If you need assistance day of the event, please ask for the House Manager.

i Accessible Entrance

The theatre's glass main entrance doors require guests to navigate three steps to enter the lobby. An alternative accessible entrance into the theatre via a ramp is located just west of the main entrance, near the corner of Ida B. Wells Dr and Wabash Ave.

i Accessible Restrooms

Two (2) accessible all-gender restrooms are located in the southwest corner, on the main floor. Two (2) additional accessible all-gender restrooms are located on the third floor.

i Elevator

Our elevator is located in the Northwest corner of our main floor lobby. For further assistance, please see any Auditorium Theatre Team Member.

i Additional Accessibility

For additional accessible service requests such as Audio Description, American Sign Language Interpretation, Closed/Open Captioning Services, or any questions beyond the scope of ticketing, please indicate this at the time of purchase. We ask that requests be made three weeks prior to event date, in order to secure the requested accommodations.
