Deeply Rooted Dance Theater

Deeply Rooted Dance Theater reimagines and diversifies the aesthetics of contemporary dance by uniting modern, classical, American, and African American traditions in dance and storytelling. Celebrating more than 27 years as one of the most renowned dance companies in Chicago, Deeply Rooted kicks off the Auditorium Theatre's 2023-24 Made in Chicago Dance Series with a program that shows the full spectrum of Deeply Rooted's impressive trajectory. The evening features the world premiere of *Madonna Anno Domini* from Artistic Director Nicole Clarke-Springer, a piece that explores activism and the similarities and differences between the Civil Rights movement in the 1960's and the movement in the 2020's. Back by popular demand, is *Ulysses Dove's Vespers* alongside revivals of works by co-founders **Gary Abbott** and **Kevin lega Jeff** to complete the program. 
Loreena McKennitt is well known as a composer and singer. In a recording career spanning more than two decades, McKennitt's 'eclectic Celtic' music has received critical acclaim world-wide, and gold, platinum and multi-platinum sales awards in 15 countries across four continents. To date, she has sold over 14 million albums with a catalogue that includes seven studio recordings, three seasonal recordings, a live in-concert DVD and two DVD documentaries. She's won two Junos, Canada's premiere music award, garnered two GRAMMY® nominations, and has performed for Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. McKennitt was inducted into the Canadian Songwriter's Hall of Fame, March 8, 2023. Tickets start at \$34.50.

Chicago Sinfonietta presents DEPTH Sunday, November 5, at 3PM


The Chicago Sinfonietta presents an afternoon of musical exploration with DEPTH, featuring renowned guest conductor Carlos Miguel Prieto and a lineup of works that delve into the complexities of the human experience. The program includes *Sinfonia India* by Carlos Chavez, in which indigenous Mexican folk melodies blend seamlessly with the Western classical tradition; Juan Pablo Contreras' *Mariachitlán*, which blends traditional Mexican music with modern orchestral sounds; and Dimitri Shostakovich's *Symphony No. 5*, a powerful and deeply moving work that reflects the composer's struggle to create art under the oppressive Soviet regime.
